	<b>Delegate to County Convention</b> Vote for not more than 6	The estimated millage that will be levied for the proposed bonds in 2025, under current law, is 2.35 mills (\$2.35 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a 0.00 mills net increase over the prior year's levy. The maximum number of years the bonds of any series may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is thirty (30) years. The estimated simple average annual millage anticipated to be required to retire this bond debt is 4.08 mills (\$4.08 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation).
	<input type="radio"/>	The school district does not expect to borrow from the State to pay debt service on the bonds. The total amount of qualified bonds currently outstanding is \$5,800,000. The total amount of qualified loans currently outstanding is approximately \$16,589,754. The additional estimated interest to be paid on the qualified loans that is attributable to the bonds is \$5,527,548. The estimated computed millage rate may change based on changes in certain circumstances.
